## A TALE OF TWO SALEMS PART I~PATTERNS OF CRIME AND HUNGER

On November 9 in the Dye House of Mission Mill we will welcome you to the first of a two part program exploring "The Tale of Two Cities," i.e. several factors leading to stress in some Salem neighborhoods. This program is titled "***Patterns of Crime and Hunger.***" Our two speakers are leaders particularly qualified to speak to these issues.

**Ron Hays, Executive Director of Marion Polk Food Share**, will address the changing patterns of hunger in Salem. Mr. Hays joined MPFS as director in August of 2005. He came from years of experience with the NW Medical Teams and served in many places around the world. He is a life long Oregonian and is a graduate of George Fox University. In his two years at MPFS he has organized innovative and creative new programs and has worked diligently building bridges and coalitions to combat hunger in Salem.

**Jerry Moore, Chief of Police of Salem Police Department** has over 30 years of law enforcement experience in Oregon, the last 28 with the Salem Police Department. Chief Moore has been assigned to each of the five divisions within the department, including assignments in Patrol, Investigations, Drugs and Vice, and he was the creator of the first Salem Police Street Crimes Unit.

Chief Moore is familiar with all facets of the department and understands the impact drugs, crime and nuisance issues have on the community and the officers assigned to deal with those issues. He is a lifelong Salem area resident and is a graduate of Oregon College of Education (now Western Oregon University) and the FBI National Academy. Chief Moore is married and has two sons.

Let us come together ***to learn the current trends and pressing issues in crime and hunger in Salem.*** What are the patterns? What is changing? What is most critical and needs the greatest attention? And, how can citizens help respond to these needs.
